FY16 GRANT CLOSING TASKS

- **June 30, 2016 – FY16 Grant Closes.**
- **July 7, 2016 – Estimated Closing Costs Sent to Kenya.** CATPA must report to the State Financial Services Office the amount of money needed to cover the final reimbursement costs to close the FY16 Grant. Final reimbursement expenses and obligations for all goods and services related to the grant project provided through June 30, 2016 must be sent to Kenya on or before July 7, 2016.
- **July 30, 2016 – Final & Required Reports.** It is important that grantees continue to submit all the required reports by July 30th. If you are unsure what your program is required, review the Grant Managers Guidance Manual or contact Kenya Lyons at 303-239-4560 ext2 or kenya.lyons@state.co.us
- **August 1, 2016 – Final Reimbursement Requests Submitted in COGMS.** Final reimbursement requests must be submitted in COGMS no later than August 1, 2016 to ensure your final payment is process and paid. Projects not submitting their final reimbursement by August 1, 2016 risk their final payment being deobligated and not paid.

NEWS FROM THE BOARD

The CATPA Board has gone thru several changes earlier this year.

- **Jerry Cole**, Public Representative and Board Chair, completed 12 years of consecutive service to the CATPA Board, the maximum amount allowed by statute. Jerry was originally appointed to the Board by Governor Owens on 1/20/2004 and reappointed by Governor Ritter on 12/11/2009. Jerry was an original member of the CATPA Board and was instrumental as a driving force to the creation and formation of CATPA. During Jerry's service, he brought strong leadership (serving as the Board Chair for several years), intense knowledge of auto theft prevention and a heart to maximize partnerships and working relationships among grant projects to reduce auto theft. Thank you Jerry for all your support, time and energy to CATPA!!
- **Chief Kevin Paletta**, Law Enforcement Representative and Past Board Chair, retired from the City of Lakewood at the end of May and tendered his resignation from the CATPA Board. Chief Paletta completed 7 ½ years of consecutive service to the CATPA Board. Chief Paletta was originally appointed on October 22, 2008 by Governor Ritter and then reappointed on December 15, 2011 by Governor Hickenlooper. Chief Paletta's compassion, care, thoughtful insight and law enforcement leadership and experience was highly valued by CATPA. We will miss Chief Paletta and wish him and his wife the absolute best years of life in their retirement to Florida!!
- **Josh Gates**, Public Representative, was appointed by Governor Hickenlooper on February 16, 2016 to succeed Jerry Cole. Mr. Gates resigned from the Board on May 4, 2016 due to a change in his work and inability to serve.
- **Tonia Rumer**, Insurance Representative, was elected as the Board Chairperson when Jerry Cole completed his last term of appointment in February 2016. Tonia was appointed to the Board on December 15, 2011 and was previously the Vice-Chair.
- **Sheriff Steve Nowlin**, Law Enforcement Representative, was elected as the Vice-Chair. Sheriff Nowlin was appointed on April 15, 2015 and brings a tremendous wealth of auto theft knowledge and experience.
- The Governor's Office is reviewing application appointments to replace the Public Representative and Law Enforcement Representative positions. We anticipate these positions will be appointed within the month of July 2016.
